## Nomination tips

Each nomination for an award requires responses to a series of short questions that serve as evidence supporting the Award Objectives. The judges rely solely on these responses, comparing them against the rubric for each award category rather than comparing them to other submissions.

Throughout the evaluation process, the judges use the provided evidence to assess and score nominations based on the Awards Objectives, which helps them differentiate and rank the nominations according to the criteria for each award category.

To make your nomination stand out from other potential candidates, it is crucial to establish and emphasise key points in your responses that not only address the question but also highlight the unique qualities of your nomination.

It is highly recommended to utilise data and examples from your school, classroom, educational setting, community, or any relevant context that will effectively demonstrate the impact of your responses.

Given the 500 word limit for each question, it is advisable to edit and refine your responses into key points that effectively address the question and highlight the most important aspects of your nomination.
